## RYAN T. ANDERSON THE CULTURE OF LIFE IN AMERICA

Keynote #1

Ryan T. Anderson is the Will E. Simon Senior Research Fellow at the Heritage Foundation and the founder and editor of *Public Discourse*, the online journal of the Witherspoon Institute of Princeton, New Jersey. He is the author of When Harry Became Sally: Responding to the Transgender Moment and Truth Overruled: The Future of Marriage and Religious Freedom. He has received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Princeton University and later a doctoral degree in political philosophy from the University of Notre Dame.

Anderson has made appearances on ABC, CNN, CNBC, MSNBC, and Fox News. His work has appeared in the New York Times, the Washington Post, the Wall Street Journal, the Harvard Journal of Law and Public Policy, the Harvard Health Policy Review, the Georgetown Journal of Law and Public Policy, the Weekly Standard, and National Review. Most notably, his research has been cited by two U.S. Supreme Court justices, in two Supreme Court cases.

Alveda is also known for her contributions in film, music, politics, education, and journalism. She is an actress, singer, songwriter, producer, blogger, author, Fox News Contributor, Newsmax Insider, and a television and radio personality.

Rick was ordained into the Anglican Network in Canada as a priest in the fall of 2017. He is a Certified Thanatologist (CT), Narrative Therapist (NT), speaker, workshop leader, and best-selling author. His first 31 years of experience were as an ordained Lutheran Minister and as a counselor with extensive work and ministry in palliative care and bereavement.

Rick's wisdom on this topic is much more than just theoretical – his practical knowledge comes out of his own personal experience. Rick and his four children used these principles following the death of Rick's first wife from ovarian cancer at 47 years old. Rick serves a parish in Langford, BC and provides numerous workshops across Canada and the US. His mission is to equip and train leaders and laity in ministering about loss and end of life. Rick lives in Victoria, BC with his wife, Erica.



#### DAVID BEREIT Keynote #4 WHAT TO DO NOW THAT YOU KNOW David started and led the 40 Days for Life movement through its first decade, building it

into the largest grassroots pro-life mobilization in the world. Through its network of more than 2,000 local leaders and 750,000 volunteers in 769 cities in all 50 American states and in 50 nations worldwide, 40 Days for Life has helped to save 14,643 children's lives, bring 177 workers out of the abortion industry, and close 96 abortion centers. David recently stepped away from his role as CEO of 40 Days for Life to pray, plan, and prepare for new ministry projects. David is an internationally sought-after speaker, media spokesperson, bestselling author,

and strategic advisor to many top pro-life organizations and leaders.

#### Rev. Cathie Young FINDING SACRED JOY IN SUFFERING

Workshop #1

Physical sickness and emotional pain are all around us. This workshop will deepen our understanding of the measure of Christ's presence that is available to those who suffer. Learn to engage your parishioners and extended community on how not to run from suffering, but to embrace it as part of the sacred joy of life. The Rev. Cathie Young is an Anglican priest, author, and cancer sufferer. After her own life-

threatening cancer storm, she founded "Cancer with Compassion", an outreach ministry to cancer sufferers and survivors, and authored her book Gold in the Road: Through the Cancer Storm with Jesus Christ. Having retired from congregational ministry in January 2018, Rev. Cathie's ministry focus is centered on the cancer community, who she calls her "people group." Seeking to bring comfort and hope to those with cancer, she has learned much about the role of suffering and how through it we may share more fully with Christ, our Suffering Savior, thereby bringing sanctity to earthly suffering.







Sheila Harper is the Founder and President of SaveOne, an international outreach ministry for men, women, and families suffering in silence after abortion. She holds a master's degree in biblical counseling and is the author of eight books. Her first book, SaveOne-A Guide to Emotional Healing after Abortion, has been translated and distributed in fifteen languages. SaveOne currently has 205 chapters in 21 countries. Sheila has traveled the world, speaking on the topic of abortion recovery as well as training abortion recovery leaders. After enduring seven years of personal anguish over choosing abortion, she found restoration and forgiveness through Jesus Christ. Sheila has two awesome sons and now lives in Nashville, TN with her husband, Jack.



#### Austin Ruse Workshop #5 The International Business of Abortion

What is happening on the international front related to abortion and Human Rights? Austin will answer this question and share ways we as the Church can connect our missions outreach with life-affirming ministry in underdeveloped countries.

Austin Ruse has headed the Center for Family and Human Rights (C-FAM) for nearly

20 years, a research institute dedicated to reestablishing a proper understanding of international law and protecting national sovereignty and the dignity of the human person. He holds a degree in political science and journalism from the University of Missouri. As a writer, Austin has written over 800 essays, articles, and columns for various media outlets and two books, Fake Science: Exposing the Left's Skewed Statistics, Fuzzy Facts, and Dodgy Data and Little Suffering Souls: Children Whose Short Lives Point Us to Christ. Austin resides in Virginia with his wife, Cathleen, and two daughters, Lucy and Gigi.
