ANGLICAN ADOPTION FUND

The Anglican Adoption Fund (AAF) was developed in 2015 by the Jurisdiction of the Armed Forces and Chaplaincy (ACNA), and the fund's committee was made up of Anglican Chaplains who were adoptive parents themselves.



Since 2015, the fund has helped eight Anglican families involved in international, domestic, and foster care adoptions. The fund has granted over \$15,000 in financial support. Through this fund, money is granted to help offset the cost of the adoption process. In August 2021, the jurisdictional authority of the fund was passed to AFL, which complements our position as the go-to Life-Affirming ministry of the Anglican Communion. If you believe God is calling your family to adopt, but you're not sure how you will afford it, consider seeking an adoption fund grant.
